

PHRASAL VERBS WITH 'CARRY'

phrasal verb	meaning	example
carry forward	transfer something into the next period	Any phone credit that hasn't been used won't be carried forward to the next month.
carry off	lift someone/something away or manage something successfully	I didn't think I could carry off the gothic look, but it turns out I can.
carry on (with)	continue or have an affair	My husband has been carrying on with another woman, I don't think I can carry on.
carry out	perform a task	They've carried out a few tests on my dog. It's not good news, he's very sick.
carry over	lift something from one place to another or transfer over from a previous period	Can you help carry my bags over to the car?
carry through	complete something successfully or to survive	The government carried through their plans despite opposition.
