

PHRASAL VERBS WITH 'DROP'

phrasal verb	meaning	example
drop around/round	visit someone or deliver goods	I'll be dropping around at 7, I can't stay long though.
drop back	move to the back of the group	Richards dropped back and waited for the pass from McDonough.
drop by/in/over	visit someone briefly	I dropped in on Amanda last night. She is recovering well.
drop off	take something to a place and leave it for someone or fall asleep	I'll drop off the kids at the pool, then go to work.
drop out	quit a course, school, club etc.	Shepherd will have to drop out of the race, he's hurt his knee.
drop someone in it	get someone in trouble	I didn't mean to drop you in it, I thought you told the boss you had the flu not earache.
