phrasal verb	meaning	example
live by	follow rules or beliefs	'Live by the sword, die by the sword' is my motto. Gangster runs through my veins.
live down	to stop being ashamed of something embarrassing	I got drunk and told my teacher I love him. I'll never live it down.
live for	think something is very important	I lived for the weekends when I was a teenager.
live in	the place where you live	I lived in a tree house when I was in Peru.
live it up	have fun, spend money and party	When I finished uni, I lived it up in New York for 3 months.
live off	survive on the money you earn or be financially supported	The guy I was seeing still lives off his parents so, I finished with him.
live on	survive on the money you earn or continue to exist	We'll have an extra £200 a month to live on when I get promoted.
live out	stay somewhere until you die or do something you have always dreamt of doing	I'm going to quit my job and live out my dream of running a farm.
live through	experience something unpleasant or survive through a period of time	My grandad lived through 2 wars.
live together	live with another person/other people	I'm starting Uni next week; I've got to live with 5 other people.
live up to	meet your expectations	The holiday didn't live up to my expectations, I wouldn't recommend going there.
live with	accept something unpleasant or live in the same place as another person	I still live with my parents, but I'm hoping to move out soon.
