phrasal verb	meaning	example
move ahead	advance	The government are moving ahead with the plan to demolish the hospital.
move along	progress at a satisfactory rate or tell someone to move	The renovations are moving along nicely. We should be in our dream home by February.
move away	leave the place where you live	The love of my life has moved away, I'll never see him again.
move down	move to a lower level	City have lost 3 games on the trot. They've moved down 8 places.
move in	start living in a place	I'm moving in with my boyfriend next week.
move in on	get closer to attack or takeover	Nancy is single, I'm going to move in on her before anybody else does.
move on	change your job, move people from a place	The police moved the protesters on.
move out	leave the building you live in	I've moved out of my mum's house and into a flat of my own.
move towards	get closer to or preparing for something	We are moving towards having a paperless office.
move up	move to make space or move to a higher level	I got over 90% in my test so, I moved up to the top set.
