

## PHRASAL VERBS WITH 'PASS'

phrasal verb	meaning	example
pass around/round	give to everyone	The pizza is ready. Can you pass it around while I put another one in.
pass as	pretend to be something	I don't want to pay full price. Do you think I can pass as a child?
pass away	die	My grandma is terminally ill, I think she is going to pass away soon.
pass back	return something	The teacher passed back our projects one by one and read out our results.
pass by	visit briefly or miss an opportunity	I was passing by your side of town, so I thought I'd stop and say hello.
pass down	give something to younger generations	I love passing down ghost stories about the village to my nephews and nieces.
pass for	be accepted as something when it isn't	Your painting is so good, it could pass for a Van Gogh original.
pass off	fool people into thinking something is genuine	A guy at the market is passing off fake Rolex watches as real ones.
pass on	give something to someone that was given to you	My daughter has passed on her tummy bug. I won't be at work for a few days.
pass out	lose consciousness or distribute	I was very nervous as the teacher passed out the exam papers.
pass over	ignore/leave out	We'll pass over section 4, it's not relevant to today's class.
pass through	visit somewhere without stopping or only stop briefly	I passed through the village last night, so I stopped in Aunt Mabel's for a cuppa.
pass to	give responsibility/ ownership/ an object to someone	Lilly passed the bread knife to Carly.
pass up	decline an offer	My sister passed up the chance to live in Italy for 6 months.
