see about	ask, deal with or organise	I saw the boss about finishing early, he said no.
see off	accompany someone to say goodbye or defeat an opponent	I'm going to the airport to see off my friends. They are going travelling for 6 months.
see out	accompany your guest to the door	I've seen out all the guests. Let's make a start on the tidying up.
see through	realise someone is lying or continue with something until the end	I've seen the project through to the end. It was a tough 6 months, but worth it.
see to	deal with something	I've seen to Mary's plants; I'll water them again in a few days.
