idiom	meaning	example
as happy as a pig in shit	very happy	I've given the dogs a lamb bone, they're as happy as a pig in shit.
fat pig	a fat greedy person	My brother is such a fat pig, he ate all my chocolates.
go the whole hog	be thorough, complete, extravagant	I've been suspended from school. I may as well go the whole hog and get expelled.
make a pig's ear of something	make a complete mess of something	My wife always makes a right pig's ear of the dinner.
pig out	eat lots of food	We pigged out a lot on holiday. I need to go on a diet.
piggyback	be carried on someone's back	Give Janey a piggyback. We've been walking for hours; her little legs must be tired.
pig-headed	someone is stubborn and refuses to change their mind	My husband is so pig-headed. He won't let me drive as he thinks women are bad drivers.
pigs might fly	something is unlikely to happen	<i>Carrie:</i> You never know, the new Prime Minister might cut taxes. <i>Billie:</i> Pigs might fly!
road hog	a selfish/ dangerous/ aggressive driver	Sorry I'm late, there were lots of road hogs on the roads this morning.
