

PHRASAL VERBS WITH 'ASK'

phrasal verb	meaning	example
ask about	ask how someone is or ask lots of people a question	People have been asking about you, they want to know if you're feeling better.
ask after	enquire about how someone is	My dad asked after you today, I lied and told him you were fine.
ask around	ask lots of people or invite someone to your house	I'll ask around my office and see if anyone has a keyboard you can borrow.
ask around for	make inquiries or gather information from people about something	She asked around for recommendations on the best local restaurants.
ask back	invite someone to return to a place	James was asked back for another interview.
ask down	invite someone to a lower level or place	The boss asked Josie down to his office for a discussion.
ask for	request something	I asked for mash potato instead of chips with my steak.
ask in	invite someone into your house or a room	Miss Roberts, can you ask them in please?
ask out	invite someone on a date	James asked Sasha out, but she said no in front of the whole class.
ask out for	invite someone for a specific purpose like for a meal or an event	Leela asked Lucas out for coffee.
ask over	invite someone to come to your home	We asked our neighbours over for a barbecue.
ask over to	invite someone to your home or a specific place for a purpose	We asked them over to ours for a slap-up dinner.
ask up	invite someone to a higher place or level	The host asked Lily up to the stage to accept the award.
